Mayor & Council: There was some considerable responses at the Town Hall last month with regards to water pressure on the west end of the city. After a post popped up from James Woods on a Facebook page, I started to do some addition digging with respect to a project that had been vetted and later tabled that would otherwise address the low water pressure issues. I also located the supporting files for the project, which are now in my office for inspection. Last week, I met with Turnipseed and was given a complete walk through of the proposed project and estimated projected costs. Since it has been three years from the date of the preliminary engineering report, the cost of the project has escalated to just over \$5.4 million. Please find attached correspondence from Chris Poje. The Council can mull this over and can give staff direction during the upcoming budget process. Thanks.
