



WORK SESSION

A Work Session of the Hogansville City Council was held Monday, July 20, 2020. Mayor Stankiewicz called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Present were Mayor Stankiewicz; Council Member Reginald Jackson, Council Member Marichal Price, Council Member Mandy Neese, Council Member Mark Ayers, and Council Member Toni Striblin. Also present were City Manager Jonathan Lynn, City Attorney Alex Dixon, City Clerk Lisa Kelly, Community Development Director Lynne Miller, and Lt. Jeff Sheppard.

BUSINESS

1. SPLOST – Parks & Recreation Priorities. Council Members agreed to prioritize Parks & Recreation SPLOST dollars beginning with construction of the Tower Trail V project, while simultaneously building the pavilions at Lake Jimmy Jackson. Staff will solicit bids for the construction of the wrought iron fence along the sidewalk at Askew Park in the downtown area and communicate back to Council.
2. City Logo. Council Members agreed to solicit ideas for a new City logo as an outsourced project, while also giving local artists an opportunity to submit their ideas. Staff will begin preparations to begin the project.
3. Old Library Building. Mayor gave a brief history of the property and how the City came to own it. Previous searches show the property titled to the City. Striblin asked to ensure there are no issues between the church and some of its members regarding the ownership of the property. City Attorney Alex Dixon will look into the situation but is not currently aware of any issues. Jackson asked that Dixon get with former City Attorney Jeff Todd to determine what leg work may have already been done.
4. Consent agenda. Mayor wanted to ensure that all members are ok with the consent agenda that everyone understands any item can be removed from the consent agenda. No opposition was noted to the current consent agenda process.

Mayor Stankiewicz adjourned the work session at 6:37pm.
