Elm Street Bridge Update: Contractors for the City of Hogansville are making progress on the Elm Street Bridge replacement project. The bridge was severely damaged during the December 2015 and January 2016 flood event and is being replaced with a combination of Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Georgia Department of Transportation Local Maintenance & Improvement Grant (LMIG), and Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) dollars. Crawford Grading & Pipeline is on target to have the road open within the estimated 30-day closure period. On Tuesday, contractors expect to place the double-barrel concrete culverts in the creek bed and then begin backfilling as necessary.
