I am honored to present a summary of the City's weekly administrative activities.

Last week, we held our Grand Opening at City Hall, and this move into the new building and out of the Royal Theater would not have been possible without the hard work and support from our staff, the Mayor and City Council.

As you all know, we are entering an exciting period of development, both with housing subdivisions and other projects. If you have driven past the Amphitheater recently, you may have noticed lush grass beginning to grow. We are excited for this project (and many others) and will be presenting you with two quotes/options related to project scope at the July 6th council meeting. We are also waiting for quotes regarding the shell structure.

Additionally, we had our preconstruction meeting with the contractor building Isaiah Lofton Park. The contractor will begin mobilizing this week and will begin site work on Monday, July 5th. The project is anticipated to take less than 4 months, and this is something I know we are all excited about.
