

Work Session Meeting October 6, 2025

Call to Order: Mayor Jake Ayers called the Work Session to order at 6:10 pm. Present were Council Member Michael Taylor and Council Member Kandis Strickland. Also present were City Manager Lisa Kelly, Assistant City Manager Oasis Nichols, City Attorney Alex Dixon, Police Chief Jeffrey Sheppard, and City Clerk LeAnn Lehigh. Council Member Jason Baswell, Council Member Mandy Neese, and Council Member Mark Ayers were not present at the Work Session meeting.

ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. Final Plat Approval – Moss Creek

The developer, Dream Finders, submitted the final plat for the Moss Creek Townhomes project located behind McDonald's. Planning and Zoning reviewed the plat on September 18th and again at a special meeting two weeks later, setting several conditions for their recommendation of approval. The developer has addressed most of the conditions set by the Planning and Zoning Board since the September 18th meeting.

- o The initial conditions included:
 - A water tank tie-in.
 - Energizing the site's power.
 - Installing skimmers in ponds.
 - Correcting puddling at the 54th Street and Williams Street entrances.
 - Ongoing maintenance of Best Maintenance Practices (BMPs).
 - Repairing gullies in slopes and a pond.
 - Watering the hydroseed.

The tie-in is planned for an overnight operation on Thursday or Friday to minimize disruption. Notification was received that the power to the site will be completed and energized by October 7, 2025.

The rock in the pond skimmers has been replaced with the proper size. A silt fence was installed to clearly delineate Phase 1 from Phase 2. Slopes have been re-graded, and the hydroseed has been watered. Phase 1 includes approximately 79 lots. Phase 2 has also been hydro-seeded and is already green. The developer plans to install a significant entrance monument and landscaping feature soon.

The staff's recommendation for the upcoming vote will be to approve the final plat with two conditions: the completion of the power energization and the successful water line tie-in. Once the final plat is approved and all conditions are met, the developer will be ready to receive building permits, as the building plans are already under review. A special called meeting will be scheduled in the next week for Council action.

- 2. Sprayfield Yard Lease This item was not discussed due to lack of quorum.
- 3. Road Renaming Request George Bailey This item was not discussed due to lack of quorum.

Mayor Ayers adjourned the Work Session at 6:57pm.

The motion was seconded by Council Member Neese.





AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOGANSVILLE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY; TO AMEND CHAPTER 54, ARTICLE III, SECTIONS 54-50 THROUGH 54-54, THE COMMERCIAL SOLICITATION ORDINANCE OF THE CITY, BY REPEALING SUCH ARTICLE IN ITS ENTIRETY; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO FIX AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOGANSVILLE HEREBY ORDAINS:

SECTION 1:

That Chapter 54, Article III, including Sections 54-50 through 54-54 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Hogansville be modified by deleting the language within all sections contained in such Chapter 54, Article III, in their entirety, and reserving Chapter 54, Article III, including Sections 54-50 through 54-54 of the Code, for further use.

SECTION 2:

Other than as specifically set forth in Section 1 of this new ordinance, all subsections of Chapter 54, Article III, including Sections 54-50 through 54-54 of the Code, are hereby specifically reserved.

SECTION 3:

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4:

This ordinance, after adoption by the Council and upon approval by the Mayor, shall become effective immediately.

NOTICE OF PROPERTY TAX INCREASE

The City of Hogansville intends to adopt a millage rate which will require an increase in property taxes. All concerned citizens are invited to the Public Hearings on this tax increase to be held at Hogansville City Hall, 111 High Street, Hogansville, Georgia at 07:00 pm on October 06, 2025.

Times and places of additional public hearings on this tax increase are: 10:00 am and 07:00 pm on October 06, 2025. All meetings will be held in the Council Chamber at Hogansville City Hall, 111 High Street, Hogansville, Georgia 30230.

This tentative increase will result in a millage rate of 7.95 mills. The proposed tax for a home with a fair market value of \$140,000 is approximately \$1,113.00
